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A Message from the Head of School

"In him you also are being built together into a dwelling place for God by the Spirit" - Ephesians 2:22

Queens is the most culturally diverse neighborhood in the world, and Flushing, Queens is historically the most religiously diverse community in the nation. Some people view the city's diversity as a challenge, and many avoid public discourse about matters of faith, especially as our society continues to unravel and grow more polarized. Yet for me, the rich diversity of Queens reflects the heart of our Creator. In His wisdom, God has made every person on the earth from one family and invites each one into a relationship with Him, regardless of ethnicity or past beliefs (Acts 17:22ff). Also in His wisdom, God chose to place Flushing Christian School in the center of it all.

The ethnic diversity of Queens appears in our own school. Staff and students collaborate across diverse backgrounds and communicate through language barriers as a testament to the Christ who brings all together into one body. The religious freedom that we cherish in America and the diversity that we find in Flushing allows FCS to fulfill its mission: to graduate students who think critically, love learning, and can engage their generation with the truth of the Gospel.

I was reminded recently of the importance of our mission when I met with a parent relocating to the United States with her child. This parent is coming from a country with a different cultural climate that is free from many of the toxic ideologies that have become popular in the States. She resonates with our FCS mission because she recognizes the negative influence of popular culture and the misplaced values of the public school system. She values an education that would encourage her child to flourish into a confident, well-educated adult, full of integrity, and able to think independently of the populace.

We are not perfect, but we endeavor to fulfill this parent's desire, a desire held by every parent entrusting their child to Flushing Christian School. We take our mission seriously and consider it an honor to supply an academically rigorous education with a strong Biblical worldview in our diverse community for the sake of the Kingdom.

As you read through this newsletter, you will see evidence of God's goodness through our staff and students. We celebrate the success of recent alumni and give thanks for a fruitful summer. We do all this looking forward to another year of growth, overcoming obstacles, and dependence on the one God who makes all this possible.
