### Iowa Standardized Tests

The glorious excellence of Christ appears in every aspect of our school, including in our stellar academics. Alumni consistently attend specialized high schools, with all graduates reporting that they have been adequately prepared for the high school setting.

A co-valedictorian from the class of 2022 shares that his time at FCS instilled high expectations and academic integrity in him, Christlike traits that have led him to excel at Stuyvesant High School.

Academic excellence also appears when we compare our standardized test scores with national averages.

Our students consistently score one and often two grades above their peers. This is a credit to our gifted teachers and our supportive learning environment.



To help with preparations, we review test-taking procedures and consider practice questions the weeks leading up to our tests. We also host a fun "Are You Smarter Than the Iowa Test?" game show with student contestants modeling how to walk through sample questions. Against the backdrop of this accountability, however, our teachers do not teach for tests; we teach for life.

### Middle School Electives

Twice a week, our middle school students disperse throughout the building for a time of discovery and fun. Each elective class allows students to explore new facets of life, learning different skills in music or a variety of communication forms.



Students benefit from our electives in several ways. They expand their academic and extracurricular portfolio as they head into high school. They can interact with multiple grade levels and relax from intense core studies. Whether interviewing a teacher for an Eaglets' View newspaper article or practicing a new instrument in band, each student will hone new skills for life.

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
